Square numbers:

0,1,4,9,16,25,36,49,64... Take successive differences: 1,3,5,7,9,11,13,15 Again, take successive differences: 2,2,2,2,2,2,2,2.... The second successive differences are constant (equal to 2).

Check it out to see if this works with any other powers and see if you can predict the constant for any power?

Cube numbers:
